

**PREPARATION OF FINAL PAPERS FOR PUBLICATION IN THE PROCEEDINGS OF  
8<sup>th</sup> International Workshop on Low Temperature Detectors**

Instruction for authors

## ABSTRACT

This document gives guidelines to authors of the 8<sup>th</sup> International Workshop on Low Temperature Detectors for the preparation of their papers and for the presentation itself. The instructions are intended to improve the appearance of the proceedings.

## 1. INTRODUCTION

The Proceedings of the workshop will be published in a special issue of Nuclear Instruments & Methods. Each author will receive free of charge a copy of the printed book. The Proceedings will be printed from the final copy prepared by authors on diskette. The working language of the workshop is English; however papers may be written in either of the two official ESA languages: English or French. The allowed length of the paper is 5 pages for invited presentations and 3 pages for other contributions.

## 2. TITLE BLOCK

The title should appear centred in CAPITAL LETTERS without underlining. Use more than one line if necessary, but always in single spacing. Type the author(s)' name(s) with initial capitals centred under the title, with one blank line in between.

## 3. ABSTRACT/RESUME

Start with a concise Abstract/Resume which summarises the contents of the paper.

## 4. ILLUSTRATIONS

Figures are to be numbered consecutively throughout the paper. Each figure number must be unique. Responsibility for the provision of good original drawings resides with the author. Workshop proceedings are reproduced in a normal photo-copy process where bad photocopies, blueprints or viewgraphs/ overhead sheets give poor results. An original drawing in black Indian ink or a good black and white glossy photograph of that original is preferred. Good, clean photocopies of line drawings are also acceptable. Only black and white illustrations will be accepted

### 4.1 Captions

All captions should be self-explanatory. All captions should be typed in lower case, *italic* if available. They should be single spaced if there is more than one line, and placed below the relevant figure.

### 4.2 Mounting of Illustrations

Illustrations should be included in the document or to be mounted within the text using two small pieces of thin, transparent, adhesive tape or, better still, non-permanent glue.

## 5. REFERENCES

References are to be listed and numbered at the end of the paper. refer to them in the text as (Ref. 4) or as (Refs. 15, 7, 10-12).

## 6. PAGE NUMBERING

Number the pages of your paper consecutively on the back of each page in pencil. (Do not type the page numbers on the front side).

## 7. SUBMISSION

Final papers should be submitted to the ESTEC Conference Bureau, at the latest during the workshop. At the start of the workshop you should hand over **three paper copies and a diskette** to the hostess at the registration desk. The editors of the magazine prefer Word, WordPerfect or Tex format. Postscript files are not recommended.
